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Eligibility

Team MO-KAN members attending the Donate Life Transplant Games of America fall into one of two categories by the below definitions.

While only primary team members are eligible to receive travel assistance to help offset their cost of participating in the event, support team members are able to share in the assistance dependant on the eligible team member they are attending in support of.

Primary Team Members eligible for travel assistance include:

- Donor families
- · Living donors of solid organ and/or tissue
- · Recipients of life saving, solid organ transplants (heart, liver, lung, kidney, pancrease, intestine)
- · Recipients of corneal, tissue and bone marrow transplants

Support Team Members include:

- Family, friends, and members of the general public
- Transplant professionals
- · Other interested individuals or organizations who wish to support the team and be a team member

Why We Fundraise

The goal of our fundraising effort is to help offset the cost of participation in the Games for our members.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- · Apparel and team uniforms
- · Registration fees
- · Travel and lodging while attending the event
- Celebration banquet following the event

Fundraising activities are designed to build awareness, camaraderie, team spirit, and are ideal ways to involve all team members, families, friends, and the community to bring awareness to our group as well as organ, eye and tissue donation and the need for more donors.

We encourage all members to get involved in these efforts and build friendships within your local transplant community.



Fundraising Requirements

In order for "primary" team members to be eligible to receive a travel stipend they must participate in the following:

Two (2) – Fundraising events* (one major and one minor)

Two (2) - Organ, eye and tissue donation awareness events (events that include donor registration)

Definition:

- Major fundraising events are considered events raising more than \$2500 or more for Team MO-KAN.
- Minor fundraising events are considered events raising a minimum of \$500 or more for Team MO-KAN.

*Any team member who helps secure a Family Level Sponsorship of \$500 or more will complete their minor fundraising requirement.

Some of the eligible team fundraising events / suggestions are listed below.

Examples of Major Fundraisers

- Bingo tournament
- Corn hole tournament
- Golf tournament
- Pickleball tournament
- Trivia night
- TransplantNATION magazine sales

Examples of Minor Fundraisers

- Candy bar sales
- Grocery store coupon books
- Kendra Scott Jewelry
- LulaRue (Facebook Fundraiser)
- Thirty-One (Facebook Fundraiser)

Proceeds from team fundraising activities will be credited towards the fundraising goals of the team and applied as such. Primary usage of these funds will go towards the purchase of uniforms, provision of travel assistance and other team related expenses.

All team members are asked to let the Team MO-KAN steering committee know when organizing a team fundraising event in an effort to help promote awareness of the event for our organization.

The following statement should be used when soliciting donations on behalf of our organization:

Team MO-KAN Fundraising Statement

All Donate Life Transplant Games of America fundraising solicitations should advise donors that "donations will be used for Team MO-KAN activities and expenses." We are a 501c(3) nonprofit registered with the State of Missouri.

Individual Fundraising Efforts

• Any personal solicitations of pledges and monetary donation that will benefit the individual team member only.

Proceeds from your individual efforts should go towards your individual fundraising efforts. These funds should **NOT** be turned in to the general team fund. Team MO-KAN will not keep track of individual fundraising efforts and our 501c(3) charity status **may not** be used for an individuals personal fundraising efforts.

All funds turned in from individual fundraising efforts designated for Team MO-KAN will go towards the fundraising efforts of the team as a whole.



Corporate Level Financial Partnerships and/or Grants

These are donations obtained from businesses and/or grants made by organizations for the purposes of cause-related marketing, co-branding, philanthropy, promotional, and other partnerships.

Funds received through sponsorships and grants shall be allocated at the planning committee's discretion toward future awareness events, general nonprofit expenses, and travel assistance to the Donate Life Transplant Games of America.

Team members are asked to bring potential corporate level financial partnerships to the attention of the planning committee in order to allow for appropriate discussion of the partnership prior to approaching the organization.

This is to ensure that the potential partnership fits into the mission of our organization and to avoid any duplicate asks of support.

Organ, Eye and Tissue Donation Awareness Events

Events that bring awareness to the importance of organ, eye and tissue donation. **The event should include** educational information on organ, eye and tissue donation in addition to the opportunity to register as a donor.

These can include events that a team member organizes on their own or partners with another local health organization.

Examples of Awareness Events

- · Blood drive
- Church event
- · Donate Life month event
- · Hospital health clinic or fair
- · Sporting event with a pop up booth

In addition, any event held in conjuntion with our local OPO, the Midwest Transplant Network, or other educational partner.

Team members are responsible for confirming their participation to one of the team managers prior to the event.

Organ, eye and tissue donor registrations should use one of the following donor registration sites:

Educational awareness information on organ, eye and tissue donation may be obtained by contacting one of the designated team managers in advance of your event to allow for time in obtaining it.



Travel Assistance Eligibility and Distribution

- Primary team members who meet fundraising requirements will be eligible to receive travel assistance as defined:
 - Donor family (member) receives travel stipend (one stipend per family)
 - Living donor (member) receives travel stipend (one stipend per family)
 - Organ, eye or tissue recipient (member) receives the travel stipend (one stipend per recipient)
- Any recipient under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian while participating in the Donate Life Transplant Games of America.
- Support team members will not be eligible to receive travel stipends. However, they can share in the assistance provided to the individual they are attending in support of.
- Travel assistance is calculated based on the following anticipated expenses:
 - Average airfare
 - Average accommodations (double occupancy) * 6 nights/4 people
 - · Event registration fee
 - Meals
- All travel stipends will be approved by the board and planning committee.
- Amount of travel assistance will be provided in equal amounts to each primary team member for use at their discretion for attending the event.
- In accordance with Internal Revenue Service guidelines, Team MO-KAN will report the travel stipend for each member on an IRS1099 form dependant on the amount of assistance meeting IRS requirements.
- Travel assistance may be subject to federal and state income tax. It is the responsibility of the team member
 receiving the stipend to consult with their tax advisor as to whether the travel assistance is taxable. Please be sure
 to retain all receipts and accurate records of your travel, lodging and meal expenses related to participation in the
 games to demonstrate on the tax returns, if necessary, that this money was in fact a legitimate reimbursement of
 travel expenses and not real income.
- Travel assistane will be distributed following the return of the team from the event and will be mailed no more than 30 days following the conclusion of the event. Team members eligible for assistance will be made aware of their amount prior to leaving for the event.

Other Fundraising Policies of Note

- Corporate level financial partnership requests **must** be pre-approved by the **Board** to prevent the duplication of requests. Team members endorsement of products is not permitted.
- For donors to qualify for a tax deductible donation, checks must be made payable to **Team MO-KAN.**
- If an individual withdraws from the team, including transferring to another team, or does not attend the Games for any reason, money that has been raised by the individual will remain as part of the Team MO-KAN's general funds.
